A Bit of History of the BA?

Business Analyst

- Traditionally associated with Waterfall projects, BRDs, FSDs, large business requirements documents
- Bridged the gap between business and technical teams
- Not mentioned on a Scrum team
- Now finding a place in the Agile world

Product Owner – A Different Perspective

- Product Owner different perspective or mindset in an Agile environment
- a well-defined problem and clear requirements - adds value to the business
- Moving from project centric to product centric

 Some organizations using Scrum – eliminate the BA role and transition to the PO role
















Why Move from a BA Role to a PO Role



BA – limited scope of a product



PO –more holistic view of a product



BA – a SME on a product knowledge area



PO- does not define solutions



BA – tactical; team focused; develop solutions



PO – strategy; owns product roadmap

How to Transition from a BA to PO Role

Ask a few questions

- What activities do you currently do that are not needed as in a Product Owner role?
- What type of mindset do you need to think and act like a Product Owner?
- What steps do you take to close any gaps to allow you to see the big picture?
- What areas of the product do you need to learn, and how do you plan to learn those?



How to Transition from a BA to PO Role




Ask a few questions

- What artifacts do I need to learn how to create?
- How do I build relationships with customers, stakeholders, or other product owners?
- What skills would I continue to leverage?

To build a Minimum Viable Product



Owns the Product Vision



Create stable and steady customer value




Provides a framework, tools and techniques

Discovery and Delivery Roadmap (strategy)

- Create a roadmap that easily and effectively articulates the flow of timelines
- **Define expectations** of when to deliver the product
- Convey priorities to your team
- Regularly demonstrate progress. Be transparent.



Agile Planning Horizons



Product Backlog

- The repository for requirements in a Scrum team
- Manage the backlog to maximize value
- Well defined acceptance criteria refine prioritization
- On a discovery journey




Business and Customer Oriented



- Central point of contact to clarify questions
- Use domain knowledge to maximize product value
- Use epics and user stories
- Emergent requirements not known in advance

Challenges, Focal Point, Skills and Competencies, Communication

- Challenges dependencies between product features, budget constraints, time constraints, justifying KPI metrics
- Focal Point during meetings build the right thing vs build the thing right
- **Skills and competencies** understand market analysis/strategy, product roadmap, release planning and tracking
- Communication and a dose of passion;
 deliver early and often; frequent feedback loop



Driving the Product, The PO and the BA



- **PO** driving the product
- PO should have direct access to the BA
- Story writing is a collective effort
- **BA** can find product gaps, perform traceability and impact analyses; ask the right questions
- PO leads the effort, helping to reduce uncertainty and ambiguity

Conclusion



Product Owner

- a decision owner
- requires a combination of skills, tools and techniques

- one of the most important roles on a software team
- Know when and how to act key to productive product outcomes
